



SQUIB EAST COAST CHAMPIONSHIPS

7-8 September 2024

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Organising Authority (OA) is Royal St. George Yacht Club.

The notation '[NP]' in a rule of the sailing instructions (SIs) means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 The prescriptions of Irish Sailing will apply.
- 1.3 The rules of the National Squib Class will apply.
- 1.4 See also SI 21.3 regarding the use of spare spinnakers.

2. COMMUNICATIONS TO COMPETITORS

- 2.1 Notices to Competitors will be posted on www.rsgyc.ie/sailing/virtual-race-office/squib-east-coast-championship/
- 2.2 The Race Office is on line at www.rsgyc.ie/sailing/virtual-race-office/squib-east-coast-championship/
- 2.3 The Race Committee (RC) may draw attention to Race Signals given on the Race Committee Vessel and communicate other information on VHF at any time. The RC will transmit on Channel 77 or other such channel as may be displayed on the Race Committee Vessel. Failure to transmit or to receive such communication will not be grounds for redress by a boat. This changes rule 62.1(a).
- 2.4 [DP] While racing, from the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 09.00 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 20.00 on the day before it will take effect.

4. CODE OF CONDUCT

- 4.1 [DP] Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials.



5. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the main club flagstaff under International Code Flag K.
- 5.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 45 minutes'
- 5.3 in the race signal A

6. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 6.1 6 Races are scheduled as follows:

Date	First race warning signal	
Saturday, 7 th Sept.	10.15 hrs. 12.00 hrs.	Competitor Briefing Up to 4 races may be sailed
Sunday, 8 th Sept.	11.00 hrs.	Remaining races to complete series

- 6.2 The warning signal for each succeeding race will be made as soon as practicable.
- 6.3 On Sunday, 8th September, the first warning signal of a race will not be made after 15.30.

7. CLASS FLAG

- 7.1 The Class Flag will be International Code Flag K

8. RACING AREA

- 8.1 The Race Area will be in the waters of Dublin Bay

9. COURSES

- 9.1 The diagram in SI Addendum 1 shows the course, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left. All marks shall be left to port unless a gate has been laid at Mark position 3, where boats must pass between the marks.
- 9.2 No later than four minutes before the warning signal, the RC will signal the number of rounds to be sailed on a white board on the RC vessel.
- 9.3 The RC may display the approximate compass bearing to Mark 1.

10. MARKS

- 10.1 Description of Marks 1, 2, 3a and 3b will be advised at the competitors briefing.
- 10.2 Description of the Start Mark will be advised at the competitors briefing.
- 10.3 Description of the Finish Mark will be advised at the competitors briefing.

11. RC VESSEL

- 11.1 The description of the RC Vessel and its location will be advised at the competitors briefing.

12. THE START

- 12.1 The starting line will be between a red and white pole on the RC Vessel displaying an orange flag at the starboard end and the Start Mark, (see 10.2 above), at the port end.



- 12.2 The RC may attempt to broadcast Individual Recall OCS sail numbers no earlier than one minute after the starting signal, on VHF channel 77.
- 12.3 When Rule 30.4 (Black Flag Rule) applies, and following a general recall, the RC may, in addition to the requirements of Rule 30.4, broadcast sail numbers on VHF channel 77.
- 12.4 When the RC determines that a boat has not complied with Rule 29.1, 30.1, 30.3 or 30.4, or with sailing instruction 12.5, the RC may broadcast the boat's sail number on VHF channel 77, no earlier than one minute after the starting signal. Failure to broadcast, or errors in the broadcast, will not be grounds for a request for redress by a boat. This changes Rule 62.1(a).
- 12.5 A boat starting later than 5 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes Rules A4 and A5.

13. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

- 13.1 Minor adjustments of mark positions will not be signalled by the RC.
- 13.2 When a change of course (which may not be minor) is indicated by a RC vessel, Boats shall round one of the adjoining leeward gate marks or the adjoining windward mark and offset mark as appropriate before heading towards the new windward or leeward marks.

14. THE FINISH

- 14.1 The finish line will be between a red and white pole on the RC Vessel flying a Blue flag, and the Finish Mark, (see 10.3 above).
- 14.2 When the Blue Flag is displayed **no boat shall pass through the finishing line, in either direction**, except to finish. Any boat in breach of this SI shall be scored as DNF without a hearing. This changes Rules A4 and A5.
- 14.3 In addition to Rule 32, when a Race Committee vessel displaying International Code Flag F, making repeated sound signals, is positioned adjacent to a mark of the course, boats, having rounded that mark, shall proceed directly to the Finish line to finish. This changes Rules 32.2 and 33.

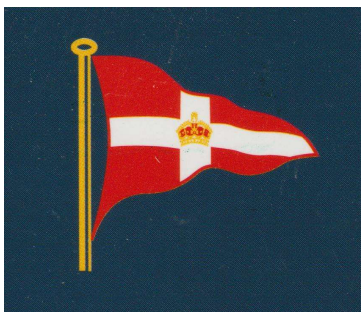
15. Not used

16. TIME LIMITS

- 16.1 The Race Time Limit (see RRS 35), and the Finishing Window are shown in the table below.

Race Time Limit	Finishing Window
75 minutes	15 minutes

- 16.2 The Finishing Window is the time for boats to finish after the first boat sails the course and finishes. Boats failing to finish within the Finishing Window, and not subsequently retiring, penalised or given redress, will be scored Time Limit Expired (TLE) without a hearing. A boat scored TLE shall be scored points for the finishing place one more than the points scored by the last boat that finished within the Finishing Window. This changes RRS 35, A5.1, A5.2 and A10.



- 16.3 'Whiskey Finish.' The Race Committee may award a finishing place to a boat by pointing Flag W at her, with a sound signal. The signalled boat is deemed to have finished and the score awarded will be the position which she occupied at that time of the signal. If two or more overlapped boats are signalled, they shall be scored as if they were tied. Any such flagged boat shall return to the start area as soon as possible. This changes RRS 28.1 and A3.

17. HEARING REQUESTS

- 17.1 Protests, Requests for Redress and Scoring Inquiries must be submitted on line at: www.racingrulesofsailing.org/events/9391/event_links
- 17.2 The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later. The time will be posted on the official noticeboard.
- 17.3 Notices will be posted online, within 15 minutes of the protest time limit, to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Location of Hearings will be in the office adjoining the atrium.
- 17.4 Notices of protests by the RC or Protest Committee will be posted online to inform boats under rule 61.1(b).
- 17.5 On the last day of the regatta, a request for reopening a hearing shall be delivered: -
(a) Within the protest time limit if the party requesting reopening was informed of the decision on the previous day.
(b) no later than 30 minutes after the party requesting reopening was informed of the decision on that day. This changes Rule 66.
- 17.6 Arbitration will be available, in accordance with Appendix T.

18. SCORING

- 18.1 Three (3) races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 18.2 When fewer than 4 races have been completed, a boat's series score is the total of her race scores.
- 18.3 When 4 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score is the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

19. SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 19.1 All competitors shall wear adequate personal flotation devices at all times when afloat, except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Dry suits and wet suits are not adequate personal flotation devices. This changes Rule 40.
- 19.2 [NP] [DP] A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee at the first reasonable opportunity. The boat must ensure this communication is acknowledged.

20. REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT

- 20.1 Substitution of crew or damaged or lost equipment will not be allowed unless approved by the RC. Requests for substitution shall be made to the RC at the first reasonable opportunity.
- 20.2 [NP] [DP] Boats shall sail with their correct sail numbers. Provision to sail under any other number shall be sought in writing from the RC before going afloat and will be granted only in exceptional circumstances. Breaches of this sailing instruction may result in protest by the RC.



- 20.3 [NP] [DP] A spare spinnaker may be carried subject to class rules. In the event that the primary spinnaker is damaged beyond repair afloat, the spare spinnaker may be used in subsequent races.

21. EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

- 21.1 A boat, crew, equipment, and safety equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules and sailing instructions.
- 21.2 Boats may carry a spare spinnaker which may only be used in the event of the primary spinnaker being damaged.

24. SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS

- 24.1 Support vessels shall register with the race office and display such marking as may be required by the RC.

26. BERTHING

- 26.1 [DP] Boats shall be kept in their assigned mooring location for the duration of the event.

27. HAUL OUT RESTRICTIONS

- 27.1 [DP] Boats shall not be hauled out during the event except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the race committee.

28. BOAT CLEANING

- 28.1 Boats shall not be cleaned below the waterline by any means between the preparatory signal of the first race and the end of the regatta.

29. PRIZES

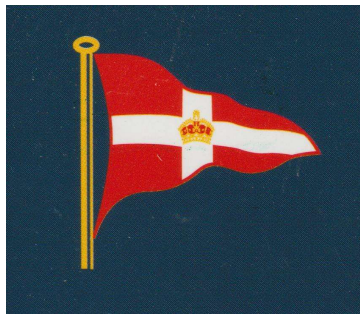
- 29.1 Per Notice of Race.
- 29.2 Only one race winner's prize may be awarded to each boat. In the event of a race winner having previously won a race, the race winner's prize will be awarded to the second or third or subsequent boat which has not already won a race winner's prize.

30. RISK STATEMENT

- 30.1 Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone."
- 30.2 Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees to and acknowledges the risk statement as included in the Notice of Race."

31. INSURANCE

- 31.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid and adequate third-party liability insurance.

3 rounds	Start – 1 – 2 – 3s/3p – 1 – 2 – 3s/3p – 1 – 2 – 3s/3p – Finish

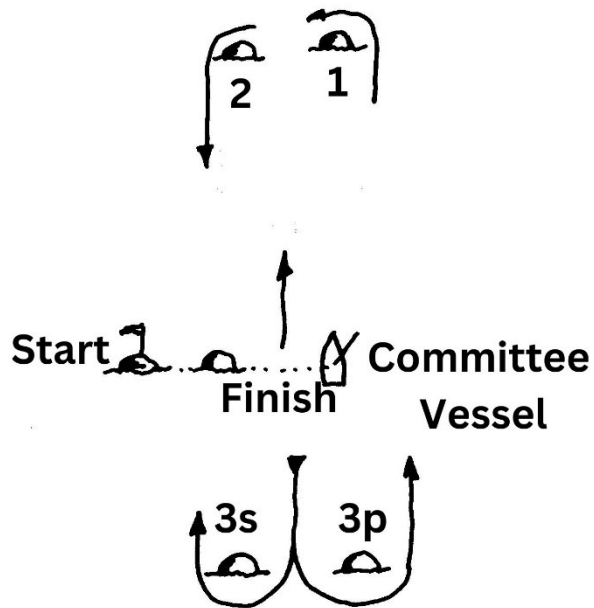
1 = Black
